Your help also enables UNICEF to provide humanitarian assistances when disasters occur. Some of the humanitarian actions carried out in 2012 include:

38.3 million children were immunized.

12.4 million people were provided with access to safe water.

3 million children had access to improved education.

2.4 million children received child protection service.

2 million children suffering from severe or acute malnutrition received treatments.

1 million people were tested, counseled and referred to treatment of HIV/AIDS.

Around the globe, poverty made hundreds of thousands of children died of preventable causes and being exploited. And a number of natural disasters and conflicts shocked the world in 2012. Children lost their home, health, family and even lives. Thanks to the contributions from dedicated supporters like you, UNICEF maintains an active presence in over 190 countries and territories. Following are some of the merits we jointly achieved.



We provided quality education opportunities to 100,000 children including preschool-aged children and girls.



Democratic People's Republic of Korea

We treated more than 20,000 children under five with severe and moderate acute malnutrition.



China

We provided healthcare services to over 1.86 million mothers and 800,000 children under five in 35 poor counties.



Colombia

We distributed life-saving relief supplies and psychosocial support to children and pregnant women affected by flooding and armed conflicts in south-western Colombia.



Zimbabwe

We continued to support HIV/AIDS prevention, care and treatment programming throughout the country, with up to 87 per cent of HIV-infected pregnant women receiving antiretroviral treatments



The Sahel Region

We provided life-saving treatment to more than 850,000 severely malnourished children under five and insecticide-treated bed nets to 7.3 million families to prevent malaria in the Sahel Nutrition Crisis.



Philippines

We provided safe drinking water to 12,585 people and distributed emergency education supplies to about 35,000 school-aged children after Typhoon Bopha attacked Philippines on 2 December.





Total Programme Assistance: HK\$27,081,600,000


